

CIRCULAR

With reference to the Department of Higher and Technical Education letter पत्रक/ वि० 1-63/ 2021-223, dated 31/01/2023, this communication serves to inform you that the Curriculum at the Undergraduate (UG) level is implemented from session 2022-26 and credit system outlined in the Four Year Under Graduate Program (FYUGP) has been meticulously revised by the State-level NEP Implementation Cell of HRD in light of "Curriculum and Credit Framework for the Four-Year Undergraduate Programme", issued by UGC on 7th December 2022, and its implementation will commence from the current session.

The total credits of the Academic year have been reduced from 22 to 20 credits and the total curriculum of FYUGP will be in a frame of 160 credits. The credits for the language and communication skill (MIL including TRL) and language and communication skill (English) papers in Semesters I and II respectively have been reduced from 6 to 4 of the existing NEP curriculums implemented from session 2022-26 so that the total number of credits in the earlier framework and the revised framework may be the same. Courses in semester I and II will remain same for the above-mentioned session but from semester III onwards the courses of new revised curriculum will substitute the courses of previous implemented curriculum.

In accordance, Ranchi University, Ranchi adopts the revised NEP 2020 framework for all the constituent and affiliated colleges from the current session 2022-26 and onwards.

Furthermore, the revised syllabi for all regular UG courses are available on the official website of Ranchi University, Ranchi. These upgraded syllabi are implemented from 3rd Semester of Academic Session 2022-26 & from 1st Semester of Session 2023-27 Onwards.

Attached herewith is a copy of the FYUGP curriculum for your perusal. We highly appreciate your prompt attention to the early measures required for the effective implementation of the program on your end.



Picture of Cultural and social cohesion by celebrating Tribal Festivals and extracurricular activities




Representation of decentralized and participative well organized management

Executive Hierarchy




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Academic Hierarchy

University commitment to the students' welfare:

- The institutional head can issue suitable orders to suspend or halt the operation of the ruling issued by the Grievance cell until the appeals are decided.
- The institutional head shall review findings of the Grievance cell when appealed. The institutional head may affirm or overturn the decision of the Grievance cell, or modify the sanctions imposed.

6.9 Maintaining Law and Order on the Campus during the Election Process

6.9.1 Any instance of acute lawlessness or the commission of a criminal offence shall be reported to the police by the university / college authorities as soon as possible, but not later than 12 hours after the alleged commission of the offence.

6.10 Miscellaneous Recommendations

6.10.1 Student representation is essential to the overall development of students, and, therefore, it is recommended that university statutes should expressly provide for student representation.

6.10.2 Student representation should be regulated by statute (either a Central Statute, State Statute or individual university statutes), incorporating the recommendations prescribed herein.

6.10.3 The institution should organize leadership-training programs with the help of professional organizations so as to groom and instill in students leadership qualities.

6.10.4 In the event of the office of any major post of office bearer falling vacant within two months of elections, re-elections should be conducted; otherwise the Vice President may be promoted to the post of President and Joint Secretary to the post of Secretary, as the case may be.

- The Grievance cell shall select the remedy or sanction most appropriate to both the type and severity of the infraction, as well as the state of mind or intent of the violator as determined by the Grievance cell. Possible remedies and sanctions include, but are not limited to, fines, suspension of campaigning privileges, and disqualification from the election.
- Any fine or total amount of fines against a candidate in an election cycle may not exceed the spending limit as defined herein above.
- If, after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of this Code were violated by a candidate, or a candidate's agents or workers, the Grievance cell may restrict the candidate, or the candidates agents or workers, from engaging in some or all campaign activities for some or all of the remainder of the campaign. If an order is issued covering only part of the remaining campaign period, it shall take effect immediately so that after its termination, the candidate will have an opportunity to resume campaigning during the days immediately prior to and including the election days.
- If, after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of either this Code or decisions, opinions, orders, or rulings of the Grievance cell have been willfully and blatantly violated by a candidate, or a candidate's agents or workers, the Grievance cell may disqualify the candidate.
- Any party adversely affected by a decision of the Grievance cell may file an appeal with the institutional head within twenty-four (24) hours after the adverse decision is announced. The institutional head shall have discretionary appellate jurisdiction over the Grievance cell in all cases in which error on the part of the Grievance cell is charged.
- The decision of the Grievance cell shall stand and shall have full effect until the appeal is heard and decided by the institutional head.
- The institutional head shall hear appeals of Grievance cell rulings as soon as possible, but not within twenty-four (24) hours after the Grievance cell delivers to the Appellant and the institutional head a copy of its written opinion in the case. Appeal may be heard prior to this time, but only if the Appellant waives the right to a written opinion and the institutional head agrees to accept the waiver.

absence of the Chair, the responsibility to preside shall fall to an Grievance cell member designated by the Chair.

6.8.12

The Grievance cell shall determine the format for the hearing, but must require that both the complaining and responding parties appear physically before the board to discuss the issues through a complaint, answered, rebuttal, and rejoinder format. The purpose of the hearing is to gather the information necessary to make a decision, order, or ruling that will resolve an election dispute. To effectuate this purpose, the following rules should prevail at all hearings:

- Complaining parties shall be allowed no more than two witnesses, however the Grievance cell may call witnesses as required. If said witnesses are unable to appear at the hearing, signed affidavits may be submitted to the Grievance cell Chair for the purpose of testifying by proxy.
- All questions and discussions by the parties in dispute shall be directed to the Grievance cell.
- There shall be no direct or cross-examination of any party or witness by complaining or responding parties during hearings.
- Reasonable time limits may be set by the Grievance cell, provided they give fair and equal treatment to both sides.
- The complaining party shall bear the burden of proof.
- Decisions, orders, and rulings of the Grievance cell must be concurred to by a majority of the Grievance cell present and shall be announced as soon as possible after the hearing. The Grievance cell shall issue a written opinion of the ruling within 12 hours of announcement of the decision. The written opinion must set forth the findings of fact by the Grievance cell and the conclusions of law in support of it. Written opinions shall set a precedent for a time period of three election cycles for Grievance cell rulings, and shall guide the Grievance cell in its proceedings. Upon consideration of prior written opinions, the grievance cell may negate the decision, but must provide written documentation of reasons for doing so.
- If the decision of the Grievance cell is appealed to the institutional head, the Grievance cell must immediately submit its ruling to the commission.

hours after they are received by either dismissing them or calling a hearing.

- 6.8.5 The Grievance cell may dismiss a complaint if:
- (i) the complaint was not filed within the time frame prescribed in Recommendation 8.4 above;
 - (ii) the complaint fails to state a cause of action for which relief may be granted;
 - (iii) the complainant has not and / or likely will not suffer injury or damage.
- 6.8.6 If a complaint is not dismissed, then a hearing must be held. The Grievance cell shall inform, in writing, or via e-mail, the complaining party and all individuals or groups named in the complaint of the time and place of the hearing. The parties are not considered notified until they have received a copy of the complaint.
- 6.8.7 The hearing shall be held at the earliest possible time, but not within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the notice described above, unless all parties agree to waive the 24-hour time constraint.
- 6.8.8 At the time notice of a hearing is issued, the Grievance cell, by majority vote, may issue a temporary restraining order, if it determines that such action is necessary to prevent undue or adverse effects on any individual or entity. Any restraining order, once issued, will remain in effect until a decision of the Grievance cell is announced after the hearing or until rescinded by the Grievance cell.
- 6.8.9 All Grievance cell hearings, proceedings, and meetings must be open to the public.
- 6.8.10 All Parties of the Grievance cell hearing shall present themselves at the hearing, may be accompanied by any other student from which they can receive counsel, and have the option to be represented by that counsel.
- 6.8.11 For any hearing, a majority of sitting Grievance cell members must be in attendance with the Chair of the Grievance cell presiding. In the

(Section 153A and Chapter IXA – “Offences Relating to Election”), may also be made applicable to student elections.

6.8 Grievance Redressal Mechanism

- 6.8.1** There should be a Grievances Redressal Cell with the Dean (Student Welfare) / teacher in charge of student affairs as its chairman. In addition, one senior faculty member, one senior administrative officer and two final year students – one boy and one girl (till the election results declared, students can be nominated on the basis of merit and/or participation in the co-curricular activities in the previous year). The grievance cell shall be mandated with the redressal of election-related grievances, including, but not limited to breaches of the code of conduct of elections and complaints relating to election-related expenditure. This cell would be the regular unit of the institution.
- 6.8.2** In pursuit of its duties, the grievance cell may prosecute violators of any aspect of the code of conduct or the rulings of the grievance cell. The grievance cell shall serve as the court of original jurisdiction. The institutional head shall have appellate jurisdiction over issues of law and fact in all cases or controversies arising out of the conduct of the elections in which the grievance cell has issued a final decision. Upon review, the institutional head may revoke or modify the sanctions imposed by the grievance cell
- 6.8.3** In carrying out the duties of the office, the Grievance cell shall conduct proceedings and hearings necessary to fulfill those duties. In executing those duties they shall have the authority:
- (i) to issue a writ of subpoena to compel candidates, agents, and workers, and to request students to appear and give testimony, as well as produce necessary records; and
 - (ii) to inspect the financial reports of any candidate and make these records available for public scrutiny upon request.
- 6.8.4** Members of the Grievance cell are prohibited from filing complaints. Any other student may file a complaint with the Grievance cell, within a period of 3 weeks from the date of declaration of results. All complaints must be filed under the name of the student filing the complaint. The Grievance cell shall act on all complaints within 24

- 6.7.9 During the election period the candidates may hold processions and / or public meetings, provided that such processions and / or public meetings do not, in any manner, disturb the classes and other academic and co curricular activities of the college / university. Further, such procession / public meeting may not be held without the prior written permission of the college / university authority.
- 6.7.10 The use of loudspeakers, vehicles and animals for the purpose of canvassing shall be prohibited.
- 6.7.11 On the day of polling, student organizations and candidates shall -:
- (i) co-operate with the officers on election duty to ensure peaceful and orderly polling and complete freedom to the voters to exercise their franchise without being subjected to any annoyance or obstruction;
 - (ii) not serve or distribute any eatables, or other solid and liquid consumables, except water on polling day;
 - (iii) not hand out any propaganda on the polling day.
- 6.7.12 Excepting the voters, no one without a valid pass / letter of authority from the election commission or from the college / university authorities shall enter the polling booths.
- 6.7.13 The election commission / college/ university authorities shall appoint impartial observers. In the case of deemed universities and self-financed institutions, government servants may be appointed as observers. If the candidates have any specific complaint or problem regarding the conduct of the elections they may bring the same to the notice of the observer. Observers shall also be appointed to oversee the process of nomination of students in institutions that are following the nomination model of student representation.
- 6.7.14 All candidates shall be jointly responsible for ensuring the cleaning up of the polling area within 48 hours of the conclusion of polling.
- 6.7.15 Any contravention of any of the above recommendations may make the candidate liable to be stripped of his candidature, or his elected post, as the case may be. The election commission / college / university authorities may also take appropriate disciplinary action against such a violator.
- 6.7.16 In addition to the above-mentioned code of conduct, it is also recommended that certain provisions of the Indian Penal Code, 1860

- 6.7.1 No candidate shall indulge in, nor shall abet, any activity, which may aggravate existing differences or create mutual hatred or cause tension between different castes and communities, religious or linguistic, or between any group(s) of students.
- 6.7.2 Criticism of other candidates, when made, shall be confined to their policies and programs, past record and work. Candidates shall refrain from criticism of all aspects of private life, not connected with the public activities of the other candidates or supporters of such other candidates. Criticism of other candidates, or their supporters based on unverified allegations or distortion shall be avoided.
- 6.7.3 There shall be no appeal to caste or communal feelings for securing votes. Places of worship, within or without the campus shall not be used for election propaganda.
- 6.7.4 All candidates shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting, all activities which are considered to be "corrupt practices" and offences, such as bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersonation of voters, canvassing or the use of propaganda within 100 meters of polling stations, holding public meetings during the period of 24 hours ending with the hour fixed for the close of the poll, and the transport and conveyance of voters to and from polling station.
- 6.7.5 No candidate shall be permitted to make use of printed posters, printed pamphlets, or any other printed material for the purpose of canvassing. Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters for the purpose of canvassing, provided that such hand-made posters are procured within the expenditure limit set out herein above.
- 6.7.6 Candidates may only utilize hand-made posters at certain places in the campus, which shall be notified in advance by the election commission / university authority.
- 6.7.7 No candidate shall be permitted to carry out processions, or public meetings, or in any way canvass or distribute propaganda outside the university/college campus.
- 6.7.8 No candidate shall, nor shall his/her supporters, deface or cause any destruction to any property of the university / college campus, for any purpose whatsoever, without the prior written permission of the college / university authorities. All candidates shall be held jointly and severally liable for any destruction / defacing of any university / college property.

- 6.5.4 Although, the Committee would refrain from prescribing any particular minimum marks to be attained by the candidate, the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
- 6.5.5 The candidate should have attained the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the university or 75% attendance, whichever is higher.
- 6.5.6 The candidate shall have one opportunity to contest for the post of office bearer, and two opportunities to contest for the post of an executive member.
- 6.5.7 The candidate shall not have a previous criminal record, that is to say he should not have been tried and/or convicted of any criminal offence or misdemeanor. The candidate shall also not have been subject to any disciplinary action by the University authorities.
- 6.5.8 The candidate must be a regular, full time student of the college / university and should not be a distance/proximate education student. That is to say that all eligible candidates must be enrolled in a full time course, the course duration being at least one year.
- 6.6 Election - Related Expenditure and Financial Accountability
- 6.6.1 The maximum permitted expenditure per candidate shall be Rs. 5000/-
- 6.6.2 Each candidate shall, within two weeks of the declaration of the result, submit complete and audited accounts to the college / university authorities. The college/university shall publish such audited accounts, within 2 days of the submission of such accounts, through a suitable medium so that any member of the student body may freely examine the same.
- 6.6.3 The election of the candidate will be nullified in the event of any noncompliance or in the event of any excessive expenditure.
- 6.6.4 With the view to prevent the inflow of funds from political parties into the student election process, the candidates are specially barred from utilizing funds from any other sources than voluntary contributions from the student body.
- 6.7 Code of Conduct for Candidates and Elections Administrators

elect the office bearer of the university student union. A graphic representation of this model is annexed herewith at Annexure IV-C.

6.2.4 A system of election wherein class representatives shall be directly elected in the colleges and universities campus and they in turn shall elect the office bearers for the college unions and the university campus union. Also they shall elect their representatives for university student union. These elected representatives from colleges and university campus shall form the Electoral College, which shall elect the office bearers of the university student union. This model shall be applicable to large university with large number of affiliated colleges. A graphic representation of this model is annexed herewith at Annexure IV-D.

6.3 Disassociation of Student Elections and Student Representation from Political Parties

6.3.1 During the period of the elections no person, who is not a student on the rolls of the college/university, shall be permitted to take part in the election process in any capacity. Any person, candidate, or member of the student organisation, violating this rule shall be subject to disciplinary proceedings, in addition to the candidature, as the case may be, being revoked.

6.4 Frequency and Duration of the Election Process

6.4.1 It is recommended that the entire process of elections, commencing from the date of filing of nomination papers to the date of declaration of results, including the campaign period, should not exceed 10 days.
6.4.2 It is further recommended that elections be held on a yearly basis and that the same should be held between 6 to 8 weeks from the date of commencement of the academic session.

6.5 Eligibility Criteria for Candidates

6.5.1 Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections. This age range may be appropriately relaxed in the case of professional colleges, where courses often range between 4 to 5 years.

6.5.2 For Post Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest and election would be 24 – 25 years.

6.5.3 For research Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.

6.1.6 Institutions must, as a primary objective, subject to the pertinent issue of discipline on campus, seek to implement a structured system of student elections by the conclusion of a period of 5 years from the date of the implementation of these recommendations.

6.1.7 Subject to the autonomy of the universities in respect of the choice of the mode of election, all universities must institute an apex student representative body that represents all students, colleges, and departments coming under the particular university. In the event that the university is geographically widespread, individual colleges may constitute their own representative bodies, which would further elect representatives for the apex university body.

6.1.8 The union/representative body so elected shall only comprise of regular students on the rolls of the institution. No faculty member, nor any member of the administration shall be permitted to hold any post on the executive of such representative body, nor shall be allowed to be a member of any such representative body.

6.2 Modes of Elections

6.2.1 A system of direct election of the office bearers of the student body whereby all students of all constituent colleges, as well as all students of the university departments vote directly for the office bearers. This model may be followed in smaller universities with well-defined single campuses (for e.g. JNU/University of Hyderabad), and with a relatively smaller student population. A graphic representation of this model is annexed herewith at Annexure IV-A.

In respect of universities with large, widespread campuses and large student bodies, either of the following models may be adopted:

6.2.2 A system of elections, where colleges and campuses directly elect college and campus office bearers, as well as university representatives. The university representatives form an electoral college, which shall elect the university student union office bearers. A graphic representation of this model is annexed herewith at Annexure IV-B.

6.2.3 A system of elections where on one hand, directly elected class representatives elect the office bearers of the college as well as the university representatives, and the campus itself directly elects the campus office bearers and the university representatives. The university representatives shall form an electoral college, which shall

The recommendation of the Committee accepted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court for implementation:

- 6.1.1 Universities and colleges across the country must ordinarily conduct elections for the appointment of students to student representative bodies. These elections may be conducted in the manner prescribed herein, or in a manner that conforms to the standards prescribed herein.
- 6.1.2 Where the atmosphere of the university campus is adverse to the conduct of peaceful, free and fair elections, the university, its constituent colleges and departments must initiate a system of student representation based on nominations, especially where elections are being held at present. It would be advisable, however, not to base such nomination system on purely academic merit, as is being practiced throughout the country.
- 6.1.3 In cases where elections are not being held, or where the nomination model prevails, the nomination model should be allowed to continue for a limited period of time. It is to be noted that the nomination system suffers from several flaws, and must only be resorted to as an INTERIM MEASURE.
- 6.1.4 Subject to the recommendations in respect of the possible models of elections, all institutions must, over a period of 5 years, convert from the nomination model to a structured election model, that may be based on a system of parliamentary (indirect) elections, or on the presidential (direct) system, or a hybrid of both. It is highly desirable that all institutions follow this mechanism of gradual conversion, especially for privately funded institutions that prefer a status quo situation.
- 6.1.5 All institutions must conduct a review of the student representation mechanism. The first review may be conducted after a period of 2 years of the implementation of the mechanism detailed above, and the second review may be conducted after the 3rd or the 4th year of implementation. The primary objective of these reviews will be to ascertain the success of the representation and election mechanism in each individual institution, so as to decide whether or not to implement a full-fledged election structure. Needless to say these reviews will be based on a consideration of the views and suggestions of all stakeholders, such as students, faculty, administration, student bodies, and parents.

- "(11) Candidate may utilize hand made posters only and pasted as per direction in clause (9)".
- "(12) No candidate shall, nor shall his/her, deface or cause any destruction to any property of the University/College campus, for any purpose whatsoever, without the prior written permission of the college/university authorities. 18. Insertion of section 23 to 26 after section 22, shall be inserted, namely -

"23. Maintaining Law and order on the campus during the Election Process

23.1 Any instance of acute lawlessness or the commission of a criminal offence shall be reported to the police by the University / College authorities as soon as possible, but not later than 6 hours after the alleged commission of the offence."

24. "The University should organize leadership training programme with the help of the professional organizations so as to groom and instill in students leadership qualities".

25. "In the event of the office of any major post of office bearers falling vacant within 2 months of elections, the Vice president may be promoted to the post of president and Joint Secretary to the post of secretary as the case may be".

26. "As per direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India the responsibility to ensure protection to the college and University administration the direction has been give to the superintendent of Police and In-charge of the Area to provide enough police protection and shall ensure that no untoward incident takes place by providing adequate number of police personnel to be posted near the place of elections".

19. The last two pages of the statutes are named as Appendix "A", "B", & "C" and are placed after section 26 of the "Statutes of Election of Ranchi University Students' Union".

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- (vii) If the decision of the Grievance cell is appealed to the institutional head i.e. The Vice-Chancellor the Grievance cell must immediately submit its ruling to the commission.
 - (viii) The Grievance cell shall select the remedy or sanction most appropriate to both the type and severity of the infraction, as well as the stand of mind or intent of the violator as determined by the Grievance cell. Possible remedies and sanctions include, but are not limited to, fines, suspension of campaigning privileges, and disqualification from the election.
 - (ix) Any fine or total amount of fines against a candidate in an election cycle may not exceed the spending limit as defined herein above.
 - (x) If after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of this code were violated by a candidate, or a candidate's agent or workers, the Grievance cell may restrict the candidate, or the candidate's agents or workers, from engaging in some or all campaign activities for some or all of the remainder of the campaign. If an order is issued covering only part of the remaining period, it shall take effect immediately so that after its termination, the candidate will have an opportunity to resume campaigning during the days immediately prior to and including the election days.
 - (xi) If, after a hearing, the Grievance cell finds that provisions of either this code of decisions, opinions, orders, or ruling of the Grievance cell have been willfully and blatantly violated by a candidate or a candidate's agents or workers, the Grievance cell may disqualify the candidate.
 - (xii) Any party adversely affected by a decision of the Grievance cell may file an appeal with the institutional head i.e. the Vice-Chancellor within twenty four (24) hours after the adverse decision is announced. The Vice-Chancellor shall have discretionary appellate jurisdiction over the Grievance cell. All cases in which error on the part of the Grievance cell is charged.
 - (xiii) The decision of the Grievance cell shall stand and shall have full effect until the appeal is heard and decided by the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (xiv) The Vice-Chancellor shall hear appeals of Grievance cell rulings as soon as possible, but not within twenty (24) hours after the Grievance cell delivers to the appellant and the Vice-Chancellor a copy of its written opinion in the case. Appeal may be heard prior to this time, but only if the appellant waives the right to a written opinion and the institutional head agrees to accept the waiver.
 - (xv) The Vice-Chancellor can issue suitable orders to suspend or halt the operation of the ruling issued by the Grievance cell until the appeals are decided.
 - (xvi) The Vice-Chancellor shall review findings of the Grievance cell, when appealed. The institutional head may affirm or overturn the decision of the Grievance cell, or modify the sanctions imposed.
16. Substitution of the numeral "22" in section 20 to the heading code of conduct shall be substituted.
17. Insertion of clause (10) to (16) to the section 22 shall be inserted, namely -
"(10) all candidate shall be prohibited from indulging or abetting all activities which are considered to be 'corrupt practices', and offences, such as bribing of voters, intimidation of voters, impersonation of voters canvassing or the use of propaganda within 100 meters of polling stations, holding public meetings during the period of 24 hours ending with the hour fixed for the close of the pole and the transport and conveyance of voters to and from polling station.

21.9 All Grievance Cell hearing, proceedings, and meetings must be open to the public.

21.10 All parties of the Grievance cell hearing shall present themselves at the hearing, may be accompanied by any other student from which they can receive counsel, and have the option to be represented by the counsel.

21.11 For any hearing, a majority of sitting Grievance cell members must be in attendance with the chair of the grievance cell presiding. In the absence of the chair, the responsibility to preside shall fall to an Grievance cell member designated by the chair.

21.12 The Grievance cell determine the format for the hearing, but must require that both the complaining and responding parties appear physically before the board to discuss the issues through a complaint, answered, rebuttal, and rejoinder format. The purpose of the hearing is to gather the information necessary to make a decision, order, or ruling that will resolve an election dispute. To effectuate this purpose, the following rules should prevail at all hearings:

- (i) Complaining parties shall be allowed no more than two witnesses, however, the Grievance cell may call witness, however, the Grievance cell may call witnesses as required. If said witnesses are unable to appear at the hearing, signed affidavits may be submitted to the Grievance cell chair for the purpose of testifying by proxy.
- (ii) All questions and discussions by the parties in dispute shall be directed to the Grievance cell.
- (iii) There shall be no direct or cross-examination of any party or witness by complaining or responding parties during hearings.
- (iv) Reasonable time limits may be set by the Grievance cell provided they give fair and equal treatment to both sides.
- (v) The complaining party shall bear the burden of proof.
- (vi) Decisions, orders and rulings of the Grievance cell must be concurred to by a majority of the Grievance cell present and shall be announced as soon as possible after the hearing. The Grievance cell shall issue a written opinion of the ruling within 12 hours of announcement of the decision.

The written opinion must set forth the findings of fact by the Grievance cell and the conclusions of law in support of it. Written opinions shall set a precedent for a time period of three election cycles for Grievance cell ruling and shall guide the Grievance cell in its proceedings. Upon consideration of prior written opinions, the grievance cell may negate the decision, but must provide written documentation of reasons for doing so.

21.5 The Grievance cell may dismiss a complaint if:

- (iii) The complaint was not filed within the time frame prescribed in section 23.4 above;
- (iv) The complaint fails to state a cause of action for which relief may be granted.
- (v) The complaint has not and/or likely will not suffer injury or damage.

21.6 If a complaint is not dismissed, then a hearing must be held. The Grievance cell shall inform, in writing, or via e-mail, the complaining party and individuals of groups named in the complaint of the time and place of the hearing. The parties are not considered notified until they have received a copy of the complaint.

21.7 The hearing shall be held at the earliest possible time, but not within twenty-four (24) hours after receipt of the notice described above unless all parties agree to waive the 24 hour time constraint.

21.8 At the time, notice of hearing is issued, the Grievance cell, by majority vote, may issue a temporary restraining order, if it determines that such action is necessary to prevent undue or adverse effects on any individual or entity. In addition, one senior faculty member, one senior administrative officer and two final year students - one boy and one girl all nominated by the Vice-Chancellor (till the election results declared, students can be nominated on the basis of merit and / or participation in the co-curricular activities in the previous year). The grievance cell shall be mandated with the redressal of election related grievance.

The judgment clearly directs in respect of the Universities with large widespread campuses in its paragraph 6.2.2 of the mode of elections which read as under :-

"A system of elections, where colleges and campuses directly elect college and campus office bearers, as well as university representatives. The university representatives form an electoral college, which shall elect the university student union office bearers." Ranchi University has to follow this model as per the judgment. The above judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court appears to be binding to the present university and non compliance of the same may amount to contempt of court and other serious consequences. Hence, there is no option now.

1. Deletion of the word "Direct" in the title of the Statutes which is now read as 'under Draft "Statutes For Election of Ranchi University Students' Union".
2. Insertion of Clause (iii) in Section 1 of the Statutes, namely- "(iii) Election process be completed latest by the end of September every year" shall be *inserted*.
3. Amendment in section 7 of the Statutes the following clause shall be *inserted* namely - "(iii) Every student registered for Ph.D. and actively engaged in research shall be a member of the Students' Union."
4. Amendment in Chapter III section 9 of the Statutes the following sub section shall be *inserted* namely - "9 A Eligibility Criteria for Candidates". And the following clause (i to vi) shall also be *inserted* in the sub section 9 A.
 - (i) Under graduate students between the ages of 17 and 22 may contest elections
 - (ii) For Professional courses and Colleges the maximum age limit would be 21-24, 17-23 for engineering and 17-24 for medical colleges.
 - (iii) For Post Graduate Students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest election would be 24-25 years.
 - (iv) For research students the maximum age limit to legitimately contest an election would be 28 years.
 - (v) The date of birth be counted on the first day of nomination.
 - (vi) The candidate must be a regular full time student of the College/University. The course duration being at least one year.
5. Substitution in Section 9 of the Statutes-The word "B" after Section 9 in heading disability/disqualification for student members as candidate for election shall be *substituted*.
6. Substitution of the numeral in clause (iii) of sub section 9B, namely - the numeral "28" shall be *substituted*.
7. Substitution in section 9 B of the statutes - clause (ix) of the sub-section 9B namely- "the candidate should in no event have any academic arrears in the year of contesting the election.
8. Substitution in section 9 of the statutes, the sub section 9 B- clause (x) shall be *substituted* namely - "the candidate should have attend the minimum percentage of attendance as prescribed by the University or 75% attendance, whichever is higher".
9. Substitution in section 9 of the statutes, the Sub section 9 C and clause (i to iii) shall be *substituted*, namely- "(i) Dissociation of Student Elections and Student Representation from Political Parties." And





Subject to the provisions of the statutes, all matters, including disputes relating to election, in the case of the college Students' Union shall be decided by the Principal of the colleges concerned, in the case of University Departments Students' Union by the Dean, Students Welfare and in the case of University Students' Union by the Pro-Vice-Chancellor whose decision shall be final.

It will be mandatory to take approval of the decision taken by the Patron by the Vice-Chancellor, the Patron Chief of the Unions.

CODE OF CONDUCT :

The following instructions should be followed strictly otherwise nomination of the candidate for election will be treated as cancelled.

1. No wall writing and poster pasting in college/ University Department/ University Head Quarter.
2. Campaign material is defined in the definition section of the Statutes which will be followed strictly.
3. No campaigning is allowed in the running class rooms.
4. Any type of meeting conducted by the candidate for election of the students' Union will be allowed only after the prior permission of the Principal/ Heads.
5. Caste and religion provocation during campaign is not allowed in any form.
6. No meeting for election purpose is allowed in the Ranchi University office premises.
7. Collection of money in public places is strictly not allowed.
8. The use of Loud Speaker for the purposes of campaigning are strictly prohibited.
9. A candidate is allowed to display one poster/ Banner in each college/ University Department on the specified place provided by the Institution.

(ii) The patron-in-chief or the patron, as the case may be, may if he considers that any item of the budget is not in accordance with the objectives of the Union, shall have powers to disallow that item of the budget.

18. **ACCOUNT AUDIT :**

There shall be a separate Bank account at University level for the University students' union which will be operated under joint signatures of Secretary of the Union & D. W. on approval of the University as per approved budget. There shall be a University Students' Union fund in which Rs. 5/- per student collected in colleges/PG Departments as Students' Union Welfare fund will be transferred.

Similarly there shall be a separate Bank account for University Departments Students' Union, which will be operated under joint signatures of Secretary of the University Department Students' Union & Senior most Dean of Faculties on approval of the University as per budget.

Likewise there shall be a separate Bank account at college level for college students' union, which will be operated under joint signatures of Secretary of the College students' Union & Principal of the College as per approved budget and on approval of the University.

AUDIT :

All the three accounts mentioned above will be audited separately by the Chartered Accountant appointed by the University for the purpose & will be placed before the General Council for approval.

19. **POWERS OF THE PATRON-IN-CHIEF OR PATRON OF THE STUDENTS' UNION**

- (i) The patron or the Patron-in-chief, as the case may be, on the advice of the Advisory Council may rescind any resolution or resolutions passed by the Students' Union which are against the objectives of the Union or prejudicial to the interests of the Institution.
- (ii) The Patron or the Patron-in-Chief may convene meetings of the General Council or the Executive Council and address it.
- (iii) When patron or the Patron-in-Chief, on the advice of the Advisory Council is satisfied that a situation has arisen, when the activities of the students' Union of the College, the University Department and the University are prejudicial to the interests of the Union or the institution or there has been gross mis-management of the affairs of the Union, he shall have the power to suspend or dissolve the Executive Council and / or the General Council of the Students' Union after recording reasons therefor.
- Provided that before suspending or dissolving the Executive Council and / or the General Council of the Students' Union, the Patron or the Patron-in-chief, as the case may be shall allow reasonable opportunity to the Executive Council of the General Council concerned why such action be not taken.

20. **POWER TO MAKE RULES**

Subject to the provisions laid down in the Statutes, the Vice-Chancellor may frame such other rules, as he considers necessary, for the election, formation and proper functioning of the University Students' Union.

There shall be at least 5 - 15 Staff Advisors of the Union who shall be appointed/ nominated by the :

- (i) Principal in the College from amongst the Senior teachers
- (ii) Patron in Chief in the University Students' Union from amongst Deans and Principals
- (iii) Patron in Chief in the University Department Students' Union from amongst the Head of the Departments and Deans of Faculties of Ranchi University .

14. The Staff Advisors will be responsible for the election process of STUDENTS' UNION.

15. UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' UNION FUND/ UNIVERSITY DEPARTMENT UNION FUND/ COLLEGE UNION FUND.

- (i) There shall be a University Students' Union fund in which Rs. 5/- per student all fees and grants received for the University/ University Department/College Students' Union will be credited.
- (ii) The Executive Council of the University Students' Union / Students' Union of the University Departments/ College Students' Union shall prepare an annual budget for the activities of the Union. The office bearer will act as member of the executive Council of the respective Unions.
- (iii) The budget prepared under-clause (ii) shall be approved by the General Council of the University Students' Union.
- (iv) The fund shall be operated by the Registrar on the advice of the Chairman of the Staff Advisors and the Secretary of the University Students' Union;
- (v) The fund be spent only on these items for which provision has been made in the budget.

16. PURPOSE OF THE UNION FUND

The University Students' Union fund, the Students' Union fund of the University Departments and College Students' Union fund shall be spent for the following purposes :

- (i) To organize debates, elocution competition, essay competition, Seminars, Symposium, Excursion and Tour, Dramatic activities, social Service and such other activities as are likely to benefit co-curricular activities of the students.
- (ii) To organize and hold sports and games, from time to time.
- (iii) To make donation to poor boy fund of the University college of University Department.
- (iv) To publish magazines
- (v) For the maintenance of the office of the Students' Union and other contingent expenditure connected thereto.

17. RESTRICTION OF EXPENDITURE

- (i) No amount of the college/University Department/ University students' Union Fund shall be spent for which provision has not been made in the budget in accordance with the purposes for which the fund shall be spent.

4) Meetings

- (i) The General Council will meet at least twice a year.
- (ii) The Executive Council will meet as often as may be necessary, but at least in a month.
- (iii) The meetings of the General Council or the Executive Council will be convened by the Secretary of the Union by giving at least 7 days notice. An emergency meeting of the Executive Council may, however, be convened in consultation with the Staff Adviser by giving at least 24 hours notice.
- (iv) All the meeting of General Council and the Executive Council shall be held at the Union Office.
- (v) An Agenda of the meeting will be issued alongwith the notice of the meeting except for an emergency meeting.
- (vi) Quorum -
In all meetings of the General Council or the Executive Council 1/3rd of the total membership of the body will constitute the Quorum.

12. The Executive Council of the Union.

(i) There shall be an Executive Council of the University Students' Union which shall consist of the following:-

- (a) The Executive Council of the University Students' Union shall consists of the office-bearers of the University Students' Union and
- (b) 11 other members to be elected by and from amongst the members of the General council of the University Students' Union by Secret Ballot.

Explanation: The Ranchi University office has two branch offices One at Jamshedpur and One at palamu. Hence these branche alongwith main R.U. Office will be treated as division. In divisions of Palamu and Jamshedpur three members be elected and for Ranchi division 5 member be elected.

- (c) The Staff Advisers of the Students' Union of the University.
- (d) The outgoing president of the union, provided he continues to be on the rolls of the college/University Department of this University.
- (ii) The members of the Executive Council mentioned in Sub-clauses (c) and (d) above will have no right to vote in the meeting of the Executive Council.
- (iii) The executive Council will function within the framework of the policies laid down by the General Council and in accordance with the Constitution.
- (iv) The Executive Council may appoint such sub-committees as may be necessary for the conduct of its business. A Sub-Committee, if appointed will be subordinate and responsible to the Executive Council.
- (v) Subject to the provisions of the Constitution the Executive Council may give advice to the office bearers of the Union as it may deem necessary in the discharge of their duties.
- (vi) The Executive Council will be responsible to the General Council.
- (vii) A member of the Executive Council shall cease to hold office as soon as his term of office bearers of his parent union ceases.
- (viii) All the office bearers of the Union shall be responsible to the Executive Council and to the general Council and will function strictly in accordance with the provisions of this Constitution.

ii) All the office bearers of the union will be directly elected by and from amongst the members of the union by a simple majority vote in accordance with this Constitution and the rules framed hereunder;

iii) The office bearers of the union shall be responsible for the smooth, orderly functioning of the union.

CHAPTER – IV

1. General Council

There shall be a General council for College Students' Union, University Department Students' Union and Students' Union of the University.

i) For College / University Department Students' Union

- a) The office bearers of the union
- b) The Staff Advisors of the union
- c) The outgoing president of the union, provided he continues to be on the rolls of the college/University Department

The members mentioned in (b), and (c) above will have no voting right in making decisions of the students' union. But they will certainly advise the office bearers.

ii) For Students' Union of the University

- a) The office bearers of University Students' Union and all its Constituent Units namely College Students' union and the Students' Union of the University Department.
- b) The Staff Advisors of the union
- c) The outgoing president of the union, provided he continues to be on the rolls of the college/University Departments.

The members mentioned in (b) and (c) above will have no voting right.

- 2) The General Council will be the supreme authority of their respective unions and shall carry on its activities of the Union in accordance with the constitution.
- 3) Subject to the provisions of this constitution, the General Council of the University Students' Union shall have the power to give such directions to the Executive Council of the University Students' Union.

6. Patron

- (i) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the patron in chief of all the students' union.
- (ii) The Pro-Vice Chancellor shall be the Patron of the students' union of the University.
- (iii) The Dean Students' Welfare shall be the Patron of the Students' Union of the University Departments.
- (iv) The principal of the college shall be the patron of the College Students' Union.

Membership of the Students' Union :

- (i) Every student studying at degree level and P.G. Level in colleges and PG level in University Deptts./PG Centre shall be a member of the Students' union.
- (ii) The students who are studying vocational/ self financing courses at the degree or Diploma/ Add-on Courses level; PG or P.G.Diploma level Courses shall also be the members of the Students' Union.

8. Funds for Welfare of the Students' through students' union:

- (i) The membership fee for the students' union shall be Rs. 20.00 (Twenty) per student per annum which will be collected at the time of admission.
- (ii) A sum of Rs. 5/- per student per annum shall be credited to the university students' union fund out of the fund collected above.

CHAPTER -III

9. Disability/disqualification for student members as candidates for election.

No student shall be entitled for election as a candidate if:

- i) He is not a member of the students' union.
- ii) He has completed 7 years in the University.
- iii) He has completed the age of 30 years
- iv) He has been held guilty of and punished for use of unfair means at an examination held by college or any university or who has been rusticated by any college or any University or who has been expelled from the hostel of the college or the University on disciplinary grounds.
- v) He has been sent up for university examination or appeared in the final university examination.
- vi) No elected office bearers shall be entitled to hold the same office twice.
- vii) A member will cease to be a member if he becomes of unsound mind & chargesheeted/convicted of any criminal offence on record any where in India or abroad.
- viii) Violation of Code of Conduct disqualifies the Students from the candidature.

Explanation: A mere warning/ show cause notice issued against a student will not be deemed to be a punishment.

10. The office bearers of the Students' Union

i) There shall be the following office bearers of the students' union:

- (a) 'Candidate' means a person who is student of Ranchi University and member of the union and going to contest a position in a students' union election.
- (b) "GC" means The General council of the students' Union
- (c) "Campaign materials" means any printed or electronic material prepared and distributed by a candidate and it includes banners, posters, pamphlets, e-mail, interviews. Wall writing and sticking of posters on walls are not under campaign materials, thus not allowed.
- (d) "Chief Returning Officer" means the person appointed among the Officers/teachers to act as chief Returning Officer (CRO) who will also be known as Chairman Advisory Council of Students' election.
- (e) Returning Officer means a person appointed among the Officers/ teachers to act as returning officer in a college and the senior most Dean/Officers in the University Departments.
- (f) "Deputy Returning Officer" means the person appointed among the Officers/teachers to act as deputy returning officer (DRO) to co-operate and assist the Returning officer.
- (g) Advisory Council means a body which includes Officers/teachers in the colleges, Deans/ Officers in the University Departments and all Deans and three Senior Principal and three active teachers of the University Departments to be nominated by the V.C.
- (h) "Elector" means a person eligible to vote in a students' union election who is member of the union.
- (i) "EC" means The Executive Council of the Students' Union of the University.
- (j) "Funds" means the fund of the students' union to be used for the welfare of the students.
- (k) "Official year" means from 16th of August of every year to the 15th of August of the following year.
- (l) Chief Patron means the Vice-Chancellor of Ranchi University.
- (m) Patron means the Pro-Vice-Chancellor for Students' Union of University Department and Principal for the college Students' Union.
- (n) Staff advisors means members of the Advisory Council.
3. Office: The office of the University students' union will be located in the premises of the Morabadi campus. It shall be its official address. The office of the college/ University Department students' union will be located in their respective college/ University Department Campus and that shall be their official address.
4. Aims and Objectives : The following will be the aims and objectives of the Students' Union.
- (i) To foster students activities and unity, designed to inculcate sense of responsibility and discipline among the students.
- (ii) To promote and enrich intellectual educational, cultural and physical development of the students.
- (iii) to encourage co-curricular activities amongst students.
- (iv) to promote among the students of the university, a sense of service to the people and duty towards the state.
- (v) to promote harmonious relations among all sections of the university community.
- (vi) to meet, discuss and make representations to the University authorities on matters concerning common interest of the students.
5. Activities:
- (i) to organize debates, elocution competition, essay competition, Seminars, Symposium, Excursion and Tour, Dramatic activities, Social Service and such other activities as are likely to benefit co-curricular activities of the students.
- (ii) to organize and hold sports and games from time to time.
- (iii) to make donation to poor boys' fund of the university, colleges and university departments.
- (iv) To publish magazines, bulletin and wall news papers which may be displayed on the notice board.
- (v) Organising and running Co-operatives.
- (vi) Such other activities as will help in enhancing aims and objectives of the union.
- (vii) to assist in solving students problems.

THE RANCHI UNIVERSITY STUDENTS' UNION

WHEREAS section 43(1) of the Jharkhand State Universities Act, 2000 directs to form a Union of students of the university consisting of all the students of the colleges and departments of the university.

WHEREAS section 43 (2) (Subs. By Act 68 of 1982) suggests that the organization and functions of the university Students' Union shall be prescribed by the statutes.

STATUTES

For Direct Election of Ranchi University Students' Union.

CHAPTER-I

SECTION 43 (2) (i) Name of the Statutes.

1. These statutes may be called The Students' Union Statutes of the University and this shall apply to Ranchi University.
 - i) There shall be a University Students' Union of which all students of the university Departments and the colleges in the university shall be members.
 - ii) Each college and the University Department, taken as a whole shall have their own students' union which will be the constituent units of the University Students' Union.
 2. The terms used in these statutes, shall have the meaning as set forth below:
-

THE JHARKHAND STATE UNIVERSITY ACT,
2000 (ADAPTED)

[As Amended by Act 6, 2003]¹

AN ACT

To establish and incorporate Affiliating-cum-Teaching Universities at
Muzaffarpur, Bhagalpur, Ranchi, Gaya (Bodhgaya) and
Darbhanga in the State of Bihar.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Bihar in the twenty-seventh year of the Republic of India as follows:-

[Comments-This Act has undergone various changes from time to time. While some amendments have been brought by the Act of Legislature, many amendments were introduced through Ordinances and continued for a long period, before being given the shape of an Act of Legislature. Reference may be made to Amending Acts 68 of 1982, 3 of 1990, 9 of 1992, 17 of 1993, 12 of 1995, 16 of 1996, 8 of 1998 & 14 of 1998, while some of the Amending Acts were in both, Hindi and English languages, some of them were published only in Hindi, since some of the Ordinances preceding such Acts as were published only in Hindi. Where having both the texts Hindi and English, by comparing the Hindi text of the Act with the Hindi text of the Ordinance English text could be extracted, where the two Hindi texts tallied exactly or involved minor translation. But where the two texts did not tally, Hindi version of the amendment has been incorporated.]

1. **Short title and commencement-** (i) This Act may be called the Jharkhand State Universities Act, 2000 (adapted)
(ii) It shall come into force at once.
(iii) It shall extend to the whole of the State of Jharkhand.
2. **Definitions-** In this Act, unless there is anything repugnant in the subject or context:-
 - (a) "annual meeting" means one of the meetings of the Senate to be held every year under sub-section (1) of section 18 and declared by the statutes to be the annual meeting of the Senate;
 - (b) "autonomous institution" means any institution declared as such under this Act and includes a College also;
 - (c) "affiliated College" means educational institution having received privileges of the University according to the provisions of this Act and University Statutes relating thereto;
 - (d) "Academic Council" means the Academic Council of the University;
 - (e) "Chancellor" means the Chancellor of the University;
 - (f) "College" means an institution maintained or controlled by the University or maintained by the State Government in which instruction is given subject to the provisions contained in clause (16) of section 4 to the students of the University up to or below the postgraduate standard under conditions prescribed in the Statutes;

³[Provided that till separate arrangement is made for Intermediate

(g) Have power to take disciplinary action against the employees belonging to the ministerial staff and to suspend them pending inquiry, to administer warning to them or to impose on them the penalty of censure or the withholding of increment;

Provided that no such penalty shall be imposed unless the person concerned has been given reasonable opportunity of showing cause against the action proposed to be taken against him;

- (ii) (a) An appeal shall lie to the Vice-Chancellor against any order of the Registrar imposing the penalty of the withholding of increment;
- (b) In a case where the inquiry discloses that a punishment beyond the powers of the Registrar is called for, the Registrar shall, upon conclusion of the enquiry make a report to the Vice-Chancellor along with the recommendation for such action as the Vice-Chancellor may deem fit.
- (c) The Registrar may be transferred by the Chancellor from one University to another University, on the same or on any equivalent post or within the same University on any other equivalent post.'

The next Ordinance in the series i.e.13 of 1987 (w.e.f. 18.4.1987) again substituted this section and it continued till Act 3 of 1990 was passed and exists till today.

- 16. The Finance Officer.**-The Finance officer shall be a whole-time officer of the University and shall act as Secretary to the Finance Committee, and shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as may be prescribed by the Statutes, the Ordinance the Regulations and the Rules or as may, from time to time be conferred, or Imposed on him by the Senate, the Syndicate, the Vice-Chancellor, the [Financial Adviser] or the Registrar.

17. Authorities of the University.- The following shall be the authorities of the University, namely:-

- (1) the Senate;
- (2) the Syndicate;
- (3) the Academic Council;
- (4) the Faculties;
- (5) the Examination Board;
- (6) the Finance Committee;
- (7) the Planning and Evaluation Committee; and
- (8) such Other authorities as may be declared to be the authorities of the University, by the Statutes.

18. The Senate.-The Senate shall consist of the following persons, namely:

Ex-Ex-Officio Members.

- (1) Chancellor;
- (2) the Vice-Chancellor;
- (3) the Pro-Vice-Chancellor;
- (4) [Commissioner and Secretary Higher Education]
- (5) the Director of Higher Education, Bihar;
- (6) the Director of Health Services, Bihar;
- (7) the Director of Technical Education, Bihar;
- (8) the Deans of Faculties;

- 2[(9) Half of such of the Heads of University Departments as are not Deans to be nominated by the Chancellor in rotations.]
- 2[(10) Ten Principals of Colleges maintained by the University as are not Deans shall be nominated by Chancellor in rotations.]
- 2[(11) Five Professors/Readers admitted to the privileges of the University in the manner prescribed in the Statutes, are not Deans shall be nominated by the Chancellor in rotations.]

(12) all ex-Vice-Chancellors of the University;

Explanation.- For the purpose of this clause, the expression ex-Vice-Chancellor who was appointed to fill a casual or temporary vacancy ;

- (13) every person who has given to the satisfaction of the Chancellor whether in one or more instalments, a sum of not less than one lac rupees in cash or in the shape of property of the equivalent value to or for the purposes of the University or of a College:

Provided that for being a life member of the Kameshwar Singh Darbhanga Sanskrit University, the fixed amount shall be twenty-five thousand rupees;

Representative Members.

- (14) ³[Six persons to be elected by and from amongst the members of the Bihar Legislative Assembly in such manner as may be prescribed by the Speaker of the Assembly, one of whom shall be from Scheduled Castes, one from Scheduled Tribes and ³one from other Backward Classes;] -
- 4[(15) one representative of the Scholar of regional language to be nominated by State-Government;
- 5[(16) (a) "Minimum of Ten teachers other than Deans, Principals and Head of University Department having at least five years teaching experience on substantive basis to be elected by and from amongst the regular teachers of the respective constituent/Govt. college get representation on rotational basis based on the seniority of colleges"
- (b) University Department shall be represented by two elected teachers, one from Science/Commerce and other from Humanities/Social Science faculty, other than Deans and Heads of Department, having at least five years teaching experience on substantive basis.
- (c) Permanently, affiliated college" (other than Government Colleges) shall be represented by one elected regular teacher/ principal having at least five years teaching experience of substantive basis.

- (20) five persons, other than ex-officio and teacher members of the Governing Body of Colleges, shall be elected by and from amongst members of the governing bodies of the University in the manner as may be prescribed in the Statutes;

Nominated Members.

- (21) three persons to be nominated by the Chancellor who are persons of scholarly pursuits;
- (22) one meritorious student to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor in the manner prescribed in Statutes, whose tenure will be of one year;
- (23) one student to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor in the manner prescribed in the Statutes, who has achieved distinction in sports and extra-curricular activities, whose tenure will be of one year;
- (24) one person to be nominated by the State Sports Council, who has achieved a distinction in sports;
- (25) Six such registered graduates, other than the teachers of the University or its colleges, as have completed a period of five years after graduation, to be nominated by the Chancellor from the panel of registered graduates prepared by the Vice-Chancellor, one of whom shall be from Scheduled Castes, one from Scheduled Tribes and one from other Backward Classes.]
- (26) Such members of the Syndicate as are not members of the Senate under the above provisions.]
- (27) Ten persons to be nominated by the State Government who are known for their academic interest, one of whom shall be from Scheduled Castes, one from Scheduled Tribes and three from other Backward Classes.]

Legislative change (after 1982)- The first change in this section was brought by Ordinance 39 of 1986 (w.e.f. 17.12.1986) by which sub-sections (9), (10), (11), and (16) were substituted and this continued by successive Ordinance till Act 3 of 1990 was passed by which the substitution was passed by which the substitution was accorded permanency. Originally these sub-section read as follows:-

1. Subs. by Act 68 of 1982.
2. Subs. by Act 17 of 1993.
3. Section 18(7) Omitted by Jharkhand Act 6 of 2003.

- “(9) such of the Head of University Department as are not Deans;
- (10) such of the Principals of Colleges maintained by the University as are not Deans.
- (11) half of the total number of Principals of Colleges admitted to the privileges of the University in the manner prescribed in the statutes, who are not Deans, shall be nominated by rotation.
- (16) thirty teachers, other than Deans, Principals and Heads of University Departments having not less than five years teaching experience, to be elected from and by the teaching staff of colleges and University Departments in such manner, as may be prescribed by the statutes, so that the teaching staff of every College and the teaching staff of every University/Department may be represented on the Senate under this sub-head in such number and at such intervals as may be prescribed by the Statutes.

Provided that the Kameshwar Singh Darbhanga Sanskrit University seven registered Acharyas of the University, seven representative teachers of the recognized institutions of Madhyama standard, four representative teachers of Tols nominated by the Chancellor, and two representative of Sanskrit Literature Association recognized by the State Government, shall be elected in the manner as prescribed in the Statutes.'

Thereafter a series of Ordinances amending different sections of this Act were promulgated but none had anything to do with this section. But Act 17 of 1993 which broke the chain of such Ordinance did touch this section also and substitution of some words in sub-section (4), substitution of sub-sections (14), (16) and (25) and Insertion of sub-section (27) were introduced. Prior to their substitution by Act 17 of 1993 which exist till today, these sub-sections, read as follows :-

"(14) ten persons, to be elected by and from amongst the members of Bihar Legislative Assembly in such manner as may be prescribed by the Speaker of the Assembly;"

"(16) fifteen teachers other than Deans, Principals and Heads of University Departments having not less than five years teaching experience to be nominated by the Chancellor in such manner as may be prescribed by the Statutes ;"

"(25) five such registered graduates, other than the teachers of the University or its colleges, as have completed a period of five years after graduation to be nominated by the Chancellor from the panel of registered graduates prepared by the Vice-Chancellor."

Provided that for the Kameshwar Singh Darbhanga Sanskrit University not more than three persons, out of which two having rendered notable service for Sanskrit Education, shall be nominated by the Chancellor in the manner, as may be prescribed in the Statutes;"

19. Term of office of members of the Senate.- 1[(1) The term of office of members of the Senate other than the ex-officio members, the members whose terms has been specified under this Act and the Life members, shall be three years from the date of their election or nomination, as the case may be, and shall include any further period which may elapse between the expiration of the said three years and the date of the next succeeding election or nomination not being an election or nomination to fill up any casual vacancy under section 64 ¹[but such extended period shall not be more than one year :

Provided that a member elected, or nominated as a representative of any body shall be deemed to have vacated office with effect from the date on which he ceases to be a member of the body which elected or nominated him:

²[Provided that the tenure of office of the elected members under sub-section (19) of section 18 shall be one year with effect from the date of their election.]

³[(2) The Senate shall have perpetual succession and any of its acts or proceedings shall not be invalid merely because of any vacancy or vacancies in its membership.]

Legislative change (after 1982)- By Act 17 of 1993 sub-section (2) was added to this section. Since none of the preceding Ordinances chain of which was broken by this Act contained such insertion, Sub-section (2) is to take effect from the date of passing of Act 17 of 1993.

(20) Meetings of the Senate.- 1[(1) The Senate shall meet twice a year, on dates to be fixed by the Vice-Chancellor, which shall be called ordinary meeting of the Senate and one of them shall be declared by the Statutes to be the annual meeting of the Senate in which the Budget of the University for the next year


